### **LTLS Offers Free Summer Reading Through TumbleBook Library**

Go to the Lincoln Trail Libraries System (LTLS) Web site at [www.lincolntail.info/whatsnew.html](http://www.lincolntail.info/whatsnew.html) to access the TumbleBook Library of “e-books for e-kids.” To promote summer reading, TumbleBooks is offering their online collection at no charge from now until August 31, 2006.

Story Books include entertaining and amusing picture books that are animated and narrated. Readers have the option of turning off the narration. TumbleReadables are large print, read-on-your-own story, chapter, and YA books.

A Life Learning section contains books that teach kids and their parents about important social and health issues in a fun, educational manner. Subjects covered are volunteerism, racial tolerance, asthma, and Alzheimers. Books are also available in Chinese, English, French, and Spanish in the Language Learning section.

Readers can keep a “Summer Reading Passport” (to be activated soon). After a book has been completed, the reader simply clicks on the “Summer Reading Passport” button and a stamp will be added to his or her passport indicating the completion of a book.

Founded in 1966, Lincoln Trail Libraries System has headquarters in Champaign and is one of 9 multitype library systems in the State of Illinois. The System serves 7 academic, 53 public, 45 school, and 17 special libraries in Champaign, Clark, Coles, Douglas, Edgar, Ford, Iroquois, Piatt, and Vermilion counties. Lincoln Trail advocates, collaborates, and facilitates education and cooperation to empower information agencies to improve and expand access to and delivery of information resources.
